AIPLA Regional Roundtable

Joe Beauchamp attended the luncheon last week. One issue is whether HIPLA is willing to set up a pro bono program. We looked at it before, but determined that there was too much risk of malpractice. However, AIPLA and the PTO are asking again.

Joe will ask Mike Lochlar and Al Riddle to the next meeting to review and think about setting up a pro bono program to assist people with low income with drafting patent applications. The PTO apparently has solutions to our problems. The program apparently works by soliciting money from industry to hire an employee to administer the program. Joe was unsure how the PTO recommends handling malpractice. Joe can also ask Mr. Calvert to speak to the Board. There are apparently programs going forward in Minneapolis and other places. Maybe inventors are signing waivers of malpractice claims? Another possibility is that the inventors sign all forms themselves as pro se applicants. The HBA's telephone dial in program had malpractice insurance, but even with it the attorneys remain anonymous. A provision in the AIA was to institute more pro bono programs and this guy (John Calvert) is working to get them started.
